#### THE JOURNEY HAS BEGUN

June has arrived! Looking back, April and May were indeed a whirl. We saw Easter, Mother's Baccalaureate graduation just one after the other. Daylight is getting longer, and summer is here. Summer activities are already in full Gardens are growing (and producing) and lawn mowers are humming. Yes, summer is here and promises to be a very busy time. Many activities are scheduled already. VBS, camps, mission trips. vacations and many other things will crowd our calendars. Yet we stop to take stock and evaluate our progress over the past few months.

In Mark 6, Jesus sent His disciples out on a mission journey. He gave them power over evil spirits and told them to preach. They were going to various cities in Israel to preach the gospel. They went in faith as Jesus told them not to take extra provision but to trust that God would supply. He told them they would face rejection as well as acceptance. Yet they were told to go.

Thinking back over the past few months, we have been given a similar challenge. We were told to go preach. We were told that God would provide. We were given abilities to reveal the glory of God. We were asked to walk in faith and trust God for all the needs. We stood for the living Nativity in December. preached Christ risen at Easter. We proclaimed God's grace to the graduating class of 2019. We have seen God provide a new leader for Kingdom Kids. We are seeing opportunities to teach these kids about Jesus on a weekly basis. We were told to go, and we went. We have witnessed great things done by God!

But I find it interesting what Jesus told His disciples on their return. In Mark 6:30-31, the disciples returned and shared with Jesus all they had seen. I can almost hear them speaking fast and excitedly as shared how demons fled and sick were healed, and people repented! Their excitement was great. You would think that Jesus would take that excitement and zeal and send them again – strike while the iron is hot, ride the wave of excitement. But that is not what Jesus did.

In verse 31, Jesus told them to "come apart to a desert place and rest". Their journey had been long and tiresome. The crowds were still pressing in for ministry. The needs were growing in number and severity. Yet Jesus told them to come and rest. Why would Jesus command this? I think we can see at least two things that are vital to ministry that we also need to observe.

First, rest indicates to take care of yourself. Have you ever been on a plane when the attendant is going over the flight safety manual? If you have, you have heard the speech that begins "if the cabin loses with pressure, oxygen mask will drop for the console above vou". Your first thought is "We're gonna die!" But after you calm down, you are told that if you are traveling with a small child, place the oxygen mask on yourself FIRST and then assist the child. To our minds. parents, this sounds as absolutely backwards. But in logical thinking, if you pass out, who will take care of your child? This is the same thought that Jesus is telling His disciples. You must care for yourself in order to care for other people. Church, through the summer, don't forget to take care of yourself - yes physically but most of all spiritually. Don't leave behind your daily devotionals, prayer times and personal worship. Stay connected in corporate worship and encourage one another to good works. Take this time to refuel spiritually because we are going to need it!

Secondly, indicates rest preparation. We have enjoyed great things in ministry for the past few months. but journey is not complete. God has even greater things in store for this church and for your life. The journey is not complete. Even the disciples were headed challenges, greater problems and obstacles. They needed this rest to prepare for the coming journey. Rest while you can because greater things await

So, this summer, have fun. Relax and enjoy the family. But realize that this is a time to refuel and prepare for the continued, greater journey that lies ahead. I cannot wait to see what God does in the coming months! Are you ready?
